Boys Cricket

Boys cricket has had some great results this season, with a couple of teams just missing finals, the future looks bright with some amazing efforts across all age groups.

great performance of 12 catches and 6 runouts in 11 games is a pretty good effort.

The girls would then collaboratively seek strategies as to support the self-regulation amongst the girls. These discussions would be accompanied with afternoon tea and then we would set about the commencement of training with full hearts and bellies. Most of our training sessions revolved around a game training approach, playing various games to assist in skill development and improving cohesiveness amongst the girls, whilst most importantly still having fun! None of our girls had played Cricket until this season, some of which had not even played organized sport other than PE at school, so the hardest task I had with coaching these girls was to do with improving fundamental skills such as hand and eye coordination. Once these skills could be developed, then we were able to move onto batting, fielding and bowling with bowling being our biggest progressive skill. Our first few games were standing starts for the bowling actions, then after a couple of games the girls began running into their bowling, which was pleasing to see. Other teams within the league were also very accommodating in allowing modifications for our girls to ensure games ran smoothly whilst still environmentally challenging.

This observation was reinforced by many of the coaches we had played against in the reverse fixtures who commented that the improvement in the girls had been remarkable.

My most enjoyed moment as a coach of QRJCC Indigo was observing the girls perseverance in the face of adversity. Without a win for the whole season, it didn't stop the girls attending training and game days nor did it dampen the spirits of the girls, who continued to stick together and smile throughout those tough moments and not give up. Morning tea was kindly provided by Cheryl McMillan for all of our match days, which included muffins, cakes and oranges. This, alongside some keen parental support, in arranging transport to various games and cheering the girls on, led to an enjoyable season that the girls did not want to end.

Since the beginning of the program, I have noticed social connections grow between these girls to an extent where they are now grouped together chatting and eating during break times in the College. Physical skill improvement through the exposure of this game has been significant with the games girls are involved in becoming more competitive as the season has progressed. With discussions before and after training, the girls are learning to coregulate and problem solve with the help of their peers whilst in a safe and supportive environment. All girls will be encouraged and supported to join the club again next season as independent club members. Team Connect will continue to support these girls next season as required.

I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank Margie at Team Connect and Sophie at QRJCC for their continued support and assistance in ensuring my needs as a coach were met throughout the season, from answering texts regarding venue changes at 9.30pm on a Friday night, to providing us with sun shelter on game days to protect the girls and their families. You are both instrumental figures in your organisations and your continued work in strengthening community ties to Cricket should be commended.
