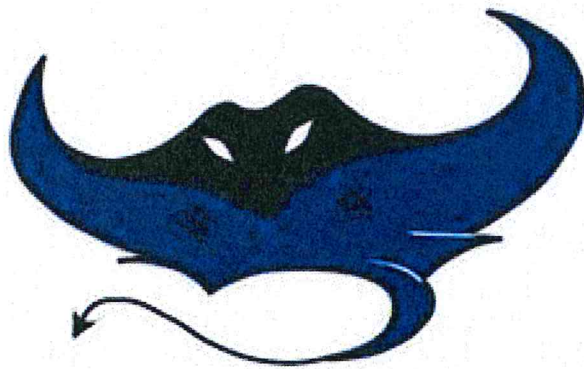

Gordon Watson Award

The junior club champion award was re-named the Gordon Watson Award during the 2008/09 season and is in recognition of Gordon's achievements and his wonderful service to cricket. It is awarded to the player who receives the most points over the season. This is worked out with every run awarded one point, every wicket awarded 12.5 points, every catch awarded 10 points, every "direct hit" run-out awarded 10 points, assisted run outs awarded 5 points and every stumping awarded 10 points. This is calculated at the end of the season and awarded to the player with the highest points over the season.

Here is a brief summary on Gordon Watson and what he has achieved throughout his wonderful service to cricket.

- Gordon's interest to cricket began as a scorer in 1950/1 as there wasn't a junior's team. However, he started playing in 1951/2 with the Wickepin Cricket Club. He played 8 seasons there (3 as Captain) until 1960. He was also club delegate for 2 seasons.
- In 1952 he captained the Junior Country week side – Wickepin/Narrogin.
- He was with the Wickepin Association from 1954 to 1960, played 7 country weeks (3 as captain, 1957, 58, 59) and was Association delegate for 3 years.
- He was with the Kondinin Club from 1960 – 1966 – 5 seasons (1 as captain). He was Club President for 3 seasons (1962/3, 1963/64 and 1964/5)
- In 1961/2 was selected in the Eastern Districts Combined side against the Western Australian State side.
- *Kalgarin-Hyden Association;*
 1. 6 Country Week (1 as Captain)
 2. Helped form a new club (Albany Country in 1968)
 3. Was Albany Country Club President, Delegate and Captain for 10 seasons.
 4. Won a Premiership in 1970/1
- *Albany Association;*
 1. Played 12 Country Weeks (10 in A Grade)
 2. Won 5 – 1967, 71, 73, 75 & 77
 3. Runners up – 1968 & 1972 (2 in seconds as Captain – 1974 & 78)
 4. B grade captain of winning Carnival team in 1976
 5. Won batting average of 84 in the above carnival
 6. Association selector for 3 seasons, 1969/70 – 70/71 & 75/76
- 1979 & 80: Umpire both Junior and Senior Country Week.



- Played for West Perth in the M.C.A for 5 seasons (3 in A grade 1980/1, 81/2 & 82/3) (2 in B grade 1978/9 & 79/80). Won MCA batting aggregate & average 1979/80 – 523 runs at 47.5. Represented MCA for 1 game in 1979/80.
- Played for City Beach in the M.C.A. for 4 seasons (2 as Captain) 1983/84 to 86/7. Best batting average in the 1984/85 season. Became Life Member in 1985/86.
- Played for W.A.C.A. Vets Subiaco-Floreat for 9 seasons, 1978 to 1985/86. Received batting award 1977/78 – 99no (highest score).
- Gordon was on the Protest and Disputes Board for Perth Mercantile Association for 1 year in 1986/87.
- Coached the Joondalup Districts Inverarity Shield team for 1 year in 2003/4.
- Gordon has also coached the Quinns Rocks Junior cricketers from 2001/02 to 2006/07 (inclusive).
- He has run the nets for the Quinns Rocks Seniors from 2007/08.

Looking back from where we are at now I think everyone has come a long way from those early days where we all had no idea what was happening. We have won only two games this season but have been so close in many others. We realise it is not all about winning but winning those two matches were special moments for the kids and parents.

The team has trained very hard on Wednesday evenings and I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Ross Fletcher for all his help in assisting me in organising training and equipment. Our early emphasis was on getting the team to bowl well and protect their wickets. After a lot of hard work and effort we became very accurate bowlers and now find ourselves taking around 10 wickets per match. After some re-focusing on scoring runs, the team scored their highest total of the season on Sunday 4th March, with some big hits and clever running between the wickets. Under 12s White

The U12 White season started with a mixture of talent, some having played U12s the previous year, and others never having played the game before. During the season many of the boys developed their ability and understanding of the game to such an extent that in my mind there is no doubt that they are ready to play in next year's U13 competitive format. Their increasing understanding of the rules, tactics and sportsmanship were noteworthy and helped them to some memorable wins and respect of other teams.

From a batting perspective, this was the first season for most, where losing your wicket meant departing the crease. The first half of the season saw some of boys just protecting their wickets and runs drying up, while others played fluently with scant regard for their eventual demise. But the best way to learn is to allow them to make mistakes, and though the season most of the boys embraced an understanding of "playing themselves in" and "building an innings". No better example than the fantastic 256/9 they put on against Wanneroo, with notable performances from Jared (56) and Sam (55), both top 10 scores for U12s in WA. The season also saw Gaije, Keir, Mark and Menno scoring 20 runs or more in an innings and Scott averaging over 63 (9th highest average for U12s in WA).

Bowling was for me the area where many really honed their skills. For some it was an improvement in their technique, for others it was just an improved belief in their ability. My most improved bowlers would have to be Cameron, Tyler and Gregor, each bagging a handful of wickets for the season. Then there were the steady wicket takers in Luke (8), Connor (7), Scott (6) and Sam (12) and the tight bowling of Menno, Mark, Jared, Keir and Jesse. But who could ever forget Gaije with his first wicket with the first ball ever bowled in a cricket match.

Of course the bowling figures were propped up some great fielding and especially some great catches and unassisted run outs, and well done to Keir for assisting with 8 dismissals in the field. But in terms of a coach's award there was little choice but to recognise an incredible season by Sam King, being our top batsman with 181 runs and top wicket-taker (12) which included a memorable hat trick. Well done Sam.

A special thanks to all the parents who assisted with attending practices and helping out at the matches, and especially Rick Sherlock for making my life a lot easier.

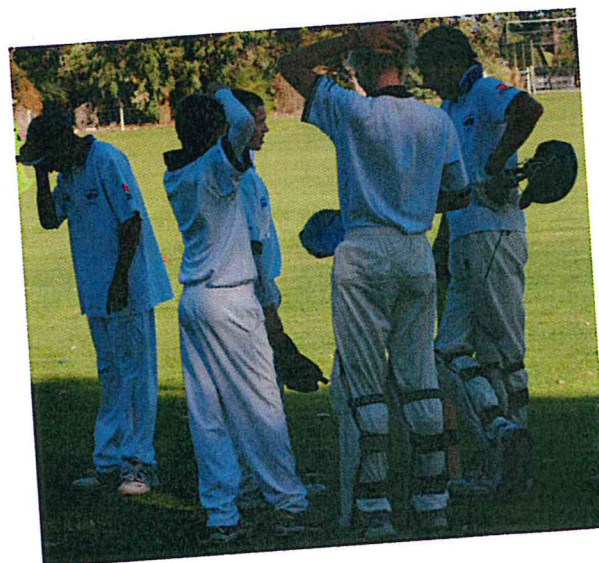
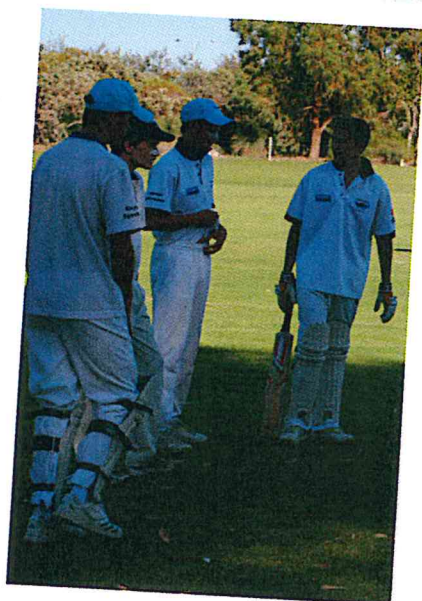
