QRJCC Junior Participation and Team Allocation Policy

Quinns Rocks Junior Cricket Club encourages boys and girls of all abilities to be involved in the game of cricket. We strive to ensure that all children develop the sense of belonging to a club that extends beyond a specific team or school cohort and encourage children to embrace new friendships that are developed as they progress through the club.

Key Participation Principles

- 1. All children should have the opportunity to enjoy their cricket at QRJCC.
- 2. All children should get the chance to bat, bowl and field as much as possible.
- 3. Children should play at the level that matches their individual age division.
- 4. We are a Community Club team allocations give children the opportunity to make new friendships, play with club-mates from different schools and to play with friends.
- 5. We welcome all new players to the club at all levels and will strive to field *viable* teams to accommodate all players.

Allocation Process of Players

A viable team has:

1. The standard number of players stated in the CJCC rules for your child's age group. These change between stages. See table below.

Note: The name change of age groups to school years was a CJCC initiative, to make it easier for parents when registering.

The following considerations are also applied to team allocation.

- 1. Players must be registered and have paid the fee
- 2. Preference will be given to returning players.
- 3. Registrations received after the closing date will not be guaranteed a position.
- **4.** Exemptions are allowed by agreement with the Registrar and President.

Player and Parent requests

QRJCC is an inclusive club that wishes to meet the specific needs of all players. Please speak to our Registrar who will ensure that your child is placed in a team that provides a positive and enjoyable cricketing experience.

QRJCC will also take into consideration any request for a player to play above or below their age group. The impact on the viability of other teams must be considered as well as the age and skill level of the player. Therefore, we cannot guarantee requests will be granted. It is also subject to approval from the North West Metropolitan Cricket Association (NWMCA) and/or the CJCC.

We will endeavour to meet requests for children to play together or continue to play together. However, if players need to be moved to create viable teams, we will attempt to move groups of players rather than one or two players.

Teams will be allocated by a subcommittee comprising of the Coaching Coordinator, Registrar and the Boys and Girls Junior Coordinators.
