














Player Leadership Group

It has been another awesome season for our girls at Quinns. We have just finished six years of all girl competitions and took to the field with 4 teams. While the number of players may appear smaller, our Stage 2 and 3 teams require 9 a side. Of our two Year 6/7 teams, one was an experienced group of players in their 2 nd year of this division – they will all move up next season. The other consisted of new players and of our youngest girls, who bravely played up, as there were not enough girls to create a Year 4/5 team. This group of girls bonded beautifully, developed their skills and had an absolute blast. Our Year 8/9 team welcomed our first female coach with original Stinger Renae Bugg taking on the role. What an inspiration for our players! Congratulations also to this team for making it to the finals. And, for the first time ever we had a team in the Year 10-12 competition. It was a competition of 12 teams and the girls enjoyed the diversity of playing against clubs from far and wide.

Our reputation as friendly, respectful, positive and inclusive players on and off the field continues. The support and encouragement our girls continue to offer each other, as well as the opposition is fantastic. Thank you also to all our teams and coaches who regularly stepped up to offer fielders to other clubs that were struggling with numbers.

The milestones and great opportunities for our female players have been plentiful. Many girls played their 50th game this season, with a large number from our Yr 6/7 team. Run totals continue to increase but we are still chasing the elusive 50. However, the ball has been knocked out of the park many times with the number of girls hitting a 6 going up dramatically! Quinns' girls again participated in the WAC run Emerging Leaders Workshops. Aimed at players 14 years of age and over, the girls participated in a series of workshops that develop all aspects of leadership. To be selected applicants addressed criteria and many of our girls have since been able to put their leadership skills into practice by becoming members of the Player Leadership Group. PLG girls also assisted at Blasters on Friday nights, by running small group activities. A group of girls (and boys) were invited to participate in the Club March

at Optus Stadium in January. Held just before a Scorchers game the players thoroughly enjoyed the experience, especially being interviewed and meeting Scorchers favs.
